SPEAKER: The bill will be...this is under our Rules, Senator Kelly. If there is any objection at all, we have agreed that it be taken off the noncontroversial list. The bill will be passed over. At this time I would like to recognize some visitors in the south balcony. 8 students with their teacher from Oakland. They are in Senator Richendifer's district and in the north balcony in Senator Maresh's district, we have 61 Seventh Grade students from Sandy Creek Public School at Fairfield with their teachers. LB 345.

CLERK: Read title. LB 345. There are Committee amendments by Senator Snyder's Urban Affairs Committee.

SPEAKER: Senator Snyder. This is the Urban Affairs Committee. Who else wants to take up those amendments. Senator Snyder is not here apparently. Is there anybody on the Urban Affairs Committee that wants to handle these Committee amendments? Are they Committee amendments, Mr. Clerk? All right. If not, we will go to the next bill, LB 486.

CLERK: Read title. LB 486.

SPEAKER: Excuse me, Mr. Clerk. On the last group of students I introduced, is that right, Senator Kremer? It was written on my list that those were from Senator Maresh's district. Actually, they are from Senator Kremer's district and the chair apologizes for the error, Senator Kremer. The clerk will please continue.

CLERK: Read. There are no Committee amendments or other amendments.

SPEAKER: Whose bill is this?

CLERK: Senator Mahoney's. Vice-chairman, I guess, of the Executive Board.

SPEAKER: Is Senator Mahoney here? Senator Carpenter, are you familiar with this?

CLERK: 486.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: This is my bill, isn't it?

CLERK: Well, it is signed by Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR CARPENTER: It has to do with the advertising. It is so simple that I ask the body to indefinitely postpone it.

SPEAKER: All right. Does anybody want to discuss this? Senator Keyes, your light is on. If there is no discussion, the question is shall LB 486 be indefinitely postponed. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays.

SPEAKER: That's 486. Right. Mr. Clerk. It is indefinitely postponed. Now, I'll recognize Senator Kelly. We are reverting back to LB 345 which we just now passed over. Yes. 345, Senator Kelly. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Senator Snyder is here now if you would want him to handle those Committee's or I can take them.

SPEAKER: All right. Senator Snyder. These are Committee amendments, I believe, on LB 345.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, I would move for the adoption
