It's OK now. Have you all voted. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill was advanced. At this time, the chair would like to recognize Mrs. Thome Johnson has some guests here. A Mrs. P. L. Cady from Arlington. Mrs. Cady is the widow of Dr. Cady. Dr. Cady served in the Senate in this body in 1935 and then he served in the Unicameral in 1937, and with Mrs. Cady is Mrs. Carrol Nelson and Mrs. Fred Laird from Fremont. Would you folks please stand? We would like to recognize you. And, also, I believe in the back of the Chamber former Senator Kjar is here. Is that correct? I mean Khar. Albert, would you please step forward? We would like to recognize you. Former member of this body. Now, Mr. Clerk, we are ready for LB 422.

CLERK: Yes sir. Read title. LB 422. There are Committee amendments by Senator Warner's Education Committee.

SPEAKER: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the Committee amendment. What the Committee amendment does, the bill is for the purpose of extending the due process procedure to Vocational-Technical Colleges and Educational Service Unit. The Committee has resolved early in the session that this type of approach apparently is required by a number of court decisions in other areas affecting teacher contracts, but the way the bill was written originally, it was a reverse type of thing, in that, it did not specifically identify the institutions which the due process was to be extended to and we rewrote the amendment so that it specifically identifies those institutions and made it a positive statement rather than as the bill was originally drafted. That explanation changes nothing as far as the intent of the original bill. I move the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER: Is there any discussion of the amendment or the amendments? Are you ready for the question? All those in favor of the amendment say aye. Those opposed no. The amendments are adopted. Are there any further amendments, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: None.

SPEAKER: Mr. Clerk, is this LB 422?

CLERK: Yes sir.

SPEAKER: That's Senator Johnson's bill.

CLERK: Yes.

SPEAKER: Now, Senator Johnson, what will you do with the bill?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that 422 be moved to E & R for Initial.

SPEAKER: Is there any discussion? Are you ready for the question? All those in favor of advancing the bill as amended vote aye. Those opposed vote no. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. LB 225.

CLERK: Read title. LB 225. There are no amendments by the Committee or other amendments.

SPEAKER: Senator Stahmer.
