SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, I move the committee amendments be adopted. Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the committee amendments merely change from, that they must meet monthly to the fact that they will meet 12 times annually, giving more discretion in when they should, where and when they should concentrate their meetings if they would so desire. They can meet monthly if they desire or they can meet you know twice in one month and then none in the next month if they so desire. So I move the adoption of the amendments and then I'll let Senator Carpenter explain it because it's his bill.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the committee amendments? If not, are you ready for the question? Question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted? All those in favor say aye, those opposed no. The amendments are adopted. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, what this bill does basically, it brings into line the same requirements and the same conditions we granted to the Indians in their commission. They can meet not to exceed 12 times a year and they can be paid \$35.00 for each meeting. That's what the bill does, I move for its adoption.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion? There are no further amendments, is that right, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: That's right.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Are you ready for the question? Question is, shall the bill be advanced as amended? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

SPEAKER: Bill is advanced. Next bill is 506A.

CLERK: Reads title. There is an amendment by Senator Carpenter. Reads.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: All this amendment does, it changes the section number in the original bill which was wrong. It strikes out the 506, that only pertains to identification and inserts 68. That's all it does. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER: Any discussion of the amendment? All those in favor of the amendment say aye, those opposed no. Amendment is adopted.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move that LB 506 as amended be advanced to E & R for Initial.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Are you ready for the question? All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 Ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

SPEAKER: Next bill is LB 485.

CLERK: Reads title. There are committee amendments, Mr. President by Senator Waldron's Miscellaneous Subjects Committee.
