SENATOR CARSTEN: I have got a question, Mr. Chairman. As I understood that original motion, there was nothing said about not passing bills. It was only that they were bracketed. Am I correct or am I incorrect.

PRESIDENT: Well, we will read the motion as we finally got it in writing here.

CLERK: The motion is as it was presented, to hold all bills on Final Reading, go to General File, move the bills toward Final Reading and expedite 259 across the Board to Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: The original motion was to hold all bills on Final Reading. Now, Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, in regard to the amendments which, of course, involve the chief motion, first of all, I want to call for a record vote, and the only reason I want a record vote is so my constituents know how I voted on this. Of course, we must understand that apparently Senator Carpenter is now abandoning Scottsbluff and I am not going to lose any sleep over that, I will tell you. I intended to vote for his bill, perhaps mistakenly, but I gave my word and that is the way it is going to be. The people of Scottsbluff can forget about this kind of stuff this session.
