CLERK: 33 ayes on a motion to return.

PRESIDENT: Very good, 378A is returned. Now we need your motion to indefinitely, strike the enacting clause. Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Yes, I move that we strike the enacting clause in LB 378A.

PRESIDENT: Very good, is there further discussion of the motion? Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I wonder if Senator Lewis would yield to a question?

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis, will you yield...

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: Did I understand you correctly, the Department could do this anyway then without the appropriation?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: I'd have to defer again to Senator Rasmussen who discussed it with them but I understand that they want the bill and they say they could manage the funding without this particular A-bill.

SENATOR WARNER: I, I, my only question is, how come they asked for money in the first place if they could do it without any?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: That's a good question. We're wondering that too.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rasmussen, do you care to give some input?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: According to my information, they have quite a large number of these books on hand and as these were sold they would use this money but they thought it was quite important that the bill did go on through.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion? Question is, shall the enacting clause in 378 be stricken? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Motion is to strike the enacting clause in 378A on Select File. Once again, have you all voted? All right, Clerk will record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, no nays.

PRESIDENT: Enacting clause is stricken in 378A. What's the next motion on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to return LB 510 to Select File for a specific amendment. Signed, Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: This amendment has to do with the amendment you adopted yesterday. They left out one section 1513 and in addition to that we also struck out sections 1 and 2 inadvertently because that was the bill in the original. This reinserts sections one and two and leaves it like it is and then it also puts in section 1513. Now this part is the reappropriation of the unexpended money for capital improvements. That's one of the things we discussed here and without this bill and without this amendment you can't do it if that's what you want to do. I move that it be moved back to Select File.
