CLERK: (Reading) Mr. President I have a motion on the desk relative to final reading. I move to expedite delivery of all bills acted upon in final reading for the balance of the session, signed Senator Carpenter.

SPEAKER: Is there any discussion of that, Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the adoption to take these bills this morning to put them on the Governors desk as soon as possible. I move the adoption of the motion.

SPEAKER: You've heard the motion. Not all of them heard the motion, Mr. Clerk. Clerk will read.

CLERK: (Read)

SPEAKER: All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is so ordered.

CLERK: Now Mr. President, I have another motion. Mr. President, I move to reconsider the final reading of LB 372, signed Senator Fowler.

SPEAKER: Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this bill I introduce on final reading this morning and failed by one vote, I was not here at that time. I'd like to move to reconsider. Certainly theres one more vote for it with me and some other people have come in. The intention of the bill is to remove some discriminatory language with regards to unemployment compensation and qualifications of pregnant women to receive that. So I'd like to move to reconsider this bill.

SPEAKER: You have heard the motion. Any discussion? All those in favor of reconsideration vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted?

SENATOR FOWLER: A Mr. Speaker, I guess I'd like to move for a call of the house. We need 3 more votes.

SPEAKER: Call of the house has been requested. I see 5 hands. Clerk will clear the board. Just a minute, do you want to withdraw that Senator Fowler. Senator Fowler has withdrawn his motion. Clerk will read the vote.

CLERK: On the original, 31 ayes, 5 nays, 13 not voting.

SPEAKER: The motion passed. Now the question is whether we have to reread it. The clerk will reread it. At this time the chair would like to announce in the south balcony, from Senator Stahmers district, we have visiting us, 30 9th grade students from Monroe Junior High, and in the north balcony, in Senator Chambers district, we have 44 students with their teachers in the 9th grade from Horace Mann school in Omaha, and the chair apologizes to Senator Richendifer, he had some students here that has now left. They were from Bisbee Public School in Arlington. Clerk will read.

CLERK: (Read)

SPEAKER: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Voting, Roll call vote read.
