

SPEAKER: All right. All those in favor of suspending the Rules and taking these bills up today vote aye. Those opposed vote no. This requires 30 votes. This is to suspend the Rules and take up tomorrow's Final Reading today. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 2 nays, 15 not voting on the motion to suspend the Rules.

SPEAKER: Motion passed. The clerk will read LB 22... Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Mr. Chairm..Mr. Chairman, Speaker, I have a Committee Hearing set today and I used my usual Room, 1009. The Sergeant at Arms was kind enough to tell me that they are working on it. They've got carpenters in there and everything. Now, I don't know whose responsibility it is around here to see that a Room, a regular Committee Room is open and available or not, but, anyhow, I can't have it. So, therefore, it is going to confuse the issue. But I'm told that I can use Room 2102 for a Committee Hearing of Constitutional Revision on LB 576. This confuses the area and I would like to know who in the heck is suppose to be responsible to see that these regular Committee Hearing rooms are open before you set a hearing. Do you know.

SPEAKER: Yes.

SENATOR SYAS: Who.

SPEAKER: The chair rules that the Executive Board is responsible and Senator Carpenter is Chairman of that Board, so I will ask him to respond in behalf of the entire Board.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, this is one of the few times the Executive Board is not perfect in its operation. I cannot answer the Senator's question but, certainly, the Board and its chairman would like to do everything to accomodate you. We do make errors. We leave these things to other people because we have things that we think are more important than this but we are sorry to inconvenience you.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, it's not inconveniencing the Committee. It's inconveniencing those that come down to testify, that have been notified where the Committee is and I don't know how they will find out where the new site is.

SPEAKER: The chair suggests, Senator Syas, that you put a sign on the door of Room 1009 that it has been changed to Room 2102.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, I am not going to make any sign. Somebody else has got to do it. I asked the Legislature for unanimous consent to hold the Hearing on LB 576 today at 12:45 in Room 2102 and if no one shows up it's not my responsibility.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, the Chairman of the Committee will take the responsibility to see to the sign is there to direct your constituents where ever they want to go.

SPEAKER: And I express the sympathy of the body to you, Senator Syas. Now, continuing with LB 226 on Final Reading.
