CLERK: Yea, I've got a bunch of stuff. Mr. President, your committee (Read)

SPEAKER: While the legislature is in session, and capable of transacting business, I announce that I have signed LB, the following bills, LB 75, 297, 333, 338, 340, 368, 370, 422, 481, 487, 493, and 572.

CLERK: Resolution #60. Introduced by Senator Hasebrook, Richendifer, Carpenter, Nore where as Mrs. Anna Melke, of Bancroft, Cummin County, celebrated her 100th birthday on April 25, 1973, where as Mrs. Melke was born in Nebraska except for a short time as a child; she has lived her life in this State, where as Mrs. Melke suffered many of the hardships of pioneer life in Nebraska and her life typifys that of early residents. Now there for be it resolved, that the legislature is happy to take this occasion to pay tribute to Mrs. Anna Melke on her, on the occasion of her 100th birthday and to wish her many more years of happy, healthy life, too that a couple of this resolution be furnished Mrs. Melke. There are attached there too various signatures of the members of the legislature. Mr. President, legislative resolution #61, signed by Senator Stull and attached there too are signatures of various members, where as Fort Robinson played a major role in the history of the frontier. Where as Fort Robinson will have been in existence for 100 years on March 5, 74' where as issuance a commemorative stamp will be fitting recognition, reminder of the public of Fort Robinsons place in history. Now there for be is resolved that the commemorative stamp committee of the United States Post Office, is requested this year a commemorative stamp in recognition of the 100th anniversary of the signing of Fort Robinson, too that a copy of the resolution be sent to the United States Post office service and the bureau of engraving.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the legislature, this is the bill that this body asked the clerk to request of the Governor to return to this body yesterday. The Governor indicated yesterday, that he would not sign this bill in it's present form and suggested that we make some amendments. The amendments have been placed on your desks a few minutes ago and this amendment is very similar to the one that was offered by Senator Barnett on Monday, when we passed a bill on final reading. The Senators turned this amendment down at that time, but since the governor has advised that he would not sign the bill without the amendment, I have consulted with several knowledgeable people, and others about this and it seems very advisable to accept this amendment.
