

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, 19 not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill is introduced. It will be referred to the Reference Committee.

CLERK: Read title. LB 584

SPEAKER: Anything further on the Clerk's desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Miscellaneous Subjects--read. That's all, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: We are now ready to go to General File. If you will look at your worksheet. I wouldn't absolutely verify this was completely correct because we have had so many motions to move bills forward but I believe it is correct except after LB 275, that's about seven or eight bills on there, we have LB 580, then. 580 is actually bracketed for today. 580, since it is bracketed for today should be the first bill considered. Then, when we get past 275, we have an order here. I believe the clerk has that. Does anybody disagree with proceeding in this manner. Taking up LB 580 first and then following the bills the way we have them on the General File until we get to 275. These are all..have all been set, I believe. They have been advanced to the top of General File. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I move that LB 580 be advanced to E & R for Initial. This 580 was merely correcting the lettering of the "d" to an "a" as a typographical error. If there is any further explanation, I will be glad to make it.

SPEAKER: Is there any discussion. If not, the question is to advance the bill. Is that correct? The amendment has been adopted?

CLERK: There are no amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: It is already for advancement. This is a corrective measure within itself. All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye. Those opposed vote no. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, 23 not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. This will bring us to LB 534. That's the Committee on Revenue.

CLERK: Read title. LB 534. There are amendments by Senator Burbach's Revenue Committee.

SPEAKER: Mr. Clerk, the chair would like to acknowledge the presence in the north balcony of 43 8th Grade Students from St. Joan of Arc School. The school is in Senator Goodrich's district and I would presume that possibly some of them might be in my district. They are here with their two teachers. Are there further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Just the Committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Senator Burbach, are you ready to take those up? Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: I'm waiting for the Clerk to read the amendments. They are Committee amendments.

SPEAKER: All right. You want the Clerk to read the amendments.

CLERK: Read the amendment? Read.
