Government be directed to contact the State Board of Equalization for the purpose of tying up general fund money to be considered in the, in the amount of tax which will be set up for the next fiscal year. Now could I pose one question to Senator Johnson, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: Proceed, Senator Marvel, Senator Johnson, will you respond to a question?

SENATOR MARVEL: Is this your understanding, Senator Johnson, that there's nothing in 449 which directs any, any department to contact the State Board of Equalization to obligate money for the, for the next fiscal year? Is this a correct statement as far as you know?

SENATOR JOHNSON: That's right. That's right, Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: Okay, that's my contribution in defense first of all, of the fiscal analyst. If you want to criticize me, that's fine but not the fiscal analyst. I'll take the heat, heat for whatever they do. Point No. 2, in direct answer to your question, as near as I can figure out, 449 has no fiscal impact.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I think that Senator Marvel has explained the impact and has reinforced what Senator Johnson has said. I think that in order to clear it up, I would move, if Senator Johnson has no objection, that we read LB 449.

PRESIDENT: Are there any objections, Senator Schmit's asking unanimous consent then to read LB 449. Are there any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Clerk will proceed to the final reading of LB 449. Thank you gentlemen.

CLERK: Reengross Legislative Bill 449. Introduced by Senator Johnson of the 15th district. (read) LB 449.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no.
