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should be done but that would be the bill and I think everyone has had the opportunity to look at it and if they don't feel that it is needed, I would ask for the adoption of the Committee amendments which is the bill at this time and this would start the procedure.

PRESIDENT: Let's begin it this way by asking everyone that is interested in the debate on this and following the Committee amendments to turn to Page 1414 in the Journal. That will put the amendment, at least, in front of you. Excuse me, 1271. Correction. Page..and Senator Stahmer's are on 1414. Do you want to locate Senator Anderson's, also. Is that someplace in there. They are not? Senator Anderson's is not in the Journal.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, my amendments were just completed Friday night. They have been reproduced. They have been placed on every members desk and if somebody can't find a copy of my amendment, please let me know. I have some extra copies and I do want people to have a chance to see them.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Anderson. All right. Senator DeCamp, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, all the amendments, in fact the whole bill is predicated and based on the Committee amendments so it would seem proper to me before we do anything else, we should adopt the Committee amendments so we have something to discuss. So I would move the adoption of the Committee amendments immediately, so that we can have a vehicle for discussion.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Just a moment. Stand by. Well, Senator DeCamp, we have a little technical problem if we do that that way. The chair is advised, for instance, if you adopt the Committee amendments, this could be a rather.. could be construed as a devious parliamentary procedure because then, you see, you place Senator Stahmer with his amendments in the position of asking for a reconsideration of the amendments...excuse me, of the Committee amendments in order to add his amendments, and so that is the reason we understand that this is somewhat clumsy but, nevertheless, we have to go to the Anderson amendments to the Stahmer amendments to the Committee amendments. I think you can see the Parliamentary procedure for that. Go ahead.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I don't feel we are trying to be devious. I feel that if we go the other way because of the very nature of this issue that it is going to add confusion rather than eliminate confusion. As everybody in this room knows, there is a lot of controversy here and it's important that we as Senators and the people, in this particular case, fully understand this issue and I don't think it can be done if we start at the tail rather than the head. The head is the bill. The bill is the Committee amendments. Let's go from there. I think Senator Stahmer and Senator Anderson would both agree and I would ask if they would agree with this if we go this route. Senator Stahmer says he has no objection and Senator Anderson...

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Anderson, I am sorry. I didn't catch your input.

SENATOR ANDERSON: I am saying that it is necessary that we first adopt the Committee amendments since both Senator Stahmer's amendments and mine work off of the Committee amendments and not off of the original bill.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Kremer. The motion before us is to adopt the Committee amendments. Senator Kremer.
