SENATOR STAHMER: Just a point of personal privilege. I'd like to point out that the opposition did not give any recriminations to me, there was no harsh words to me whatsoever and for that I am appreciative to those who had a differing point of view.

PRESIDENT: Question is, shall LB 286 be advanced from General File to E & R Initial as amended? All those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. Once again the chair would inquire if you have all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 37 ayes, no nays, 12 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Senator Carpenter has asked unanimous consent to expedite the bill. Are there any objections to the expedition of the bill? Hearing none, so ordered. Chair recognizes Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I would like to ask that LR 23 just be previous in its passage to this Legislative Bill 286. In other words, have it expedited just ahead of this one.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis is asking unanimous consent now to expedite LR 23 just ahead of 286. Are there any objections to the expedition of that Legislative Resolution? Hearing none, that is so ordered. While the Legislature was in session and capable of transacting business, I have signed LB 321, 321A, 345, 402, 449, 494 and LB 510. We next move unless the Clerk has other business on his desk to the General File consideration of Senator Warner's LB 358. Is there any business on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, there is a bunch of business here. Reads reports. Reads resolution.

PRESIDENT: 1:30 you maybe could make it, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Okay, 1:30, let's change it to 1:30, we can get back because I don't think we have any rules there that are going to be very, that is discussed very much. So 1:30.
