

in the way or reimbursement in the pension systems provided for these types of people and I am in the area where I know because I am one that gets one. I pretty near lost my life in 41' and I get the great sum of \$134.50 for the rest of my life and it is tax free for your information. So I know, how could a man like myself exist on that if I didn't have something else to be provided for. Then there was someones question about that. They had to get to city hall and check it a dozen times and see if it was justified, but here nor there my friends, I think that this gives you something for these men in the future and I am talking directly of probably doubling their pension or triple it or putting them on the basis of the Omaha police department. It is a heck of a know when you got a city that provides more benefits to their policemen than the State does for the highway patrolmen and I'll conclude with that.

SPEAKER: Senator Marsh, were you asking for the floor? Is there anybody else that wants to speak in this before I call on Senator Frank Lewis to close? Senator Frank Lewis is closing on his amendment and I think Senator you better reexplain the amendment because it was changed a little bit.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. President, I acquiesce to wiser minds than mine and we came up with a compromise amendment on this thing. I think we wanted to do two things and one was to provide some kind of a trust fund for educational purposes for the children. Certainly the small amount of money that we're talking about can not reflect the traffic loss to that family and those children. But I would certainly think we could do that and what the amendment now reads is, be a total of \$15,000 divided 7 and then \$4,000 for each child. I would urge you to adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER: Now do you understand the amendment? Are you ready for the question? All those in favor of the Frank Lewis amendment, say aye. Those opposed, no. The amendment is adopted. Now Mr. Clerk, are there further amendments?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill has now been amended, we revert to Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I would move that we advance LB 585 to E & R initial. If there is an explanation or question of it, it has been stated what we do, we set up specifically for these young boys, to have an opportunity later on in life. Plus immediate needs for the family. I would also like to request if I could, if this would be advisable to request this, that we expedite it if we pass it over to E & R--

SPEAKER: Asking unanimous consent?

SENATOR BARNETT: Yes, and also I'd like to have Senator Thome Johnson accompany me, if it is ok with the body with the patrol to---

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This is just a question about the bill. Does it have the emergency clause?

SPEAKER: Senator Barnett.
