CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

CLERK: LB 111 (Read) There are very lengthy committee amendments, signed Senator Waldron, chairman of the miscellaneous subjects committee.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, I move the committee amendments be adopted and it is Senator Carpenters bill and he was the one that brought these committee amendments to the committee and so I will ask that Senator Carpenter explain the amendments. Which do become the bill actually. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Have they adopted the committee amendments?

PRESIDENT: No, we're ready to adopt the committee amendments to 111.
