PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit. I might add that this is your second time to speak on the issue.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I'd just like to say in response to Senator Murphy's comment that the bill is changed from its original form and that's true, but Senator Murphy will learn, the longer he's a member of this body, that many pieces of legislation are going to change as they, as they move across the board so I don't see where that's a valid excuse. The bill, original intent, is there. It's an additional teller--teller facility. Let's vote on the bill, let's vote on the issue and get it resolved.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to bracket L--excuse me, are you all through discussing the issue? Senator DeCamp, do you want to have any closing? Motion is to bracket LB 312 until January 10th on final reading. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Motion before the body is to bracket LB 312 on final reading until January 10, 1974. Have you all voted? Just to relieve the tension, the Chair would advise that it would take 25 votes in this instance or I would rule that it would take 25 votes to bind the body. Okay, Clerk will record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 21 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion is lost, and we'll begin final reading with LB 312. Clerk will read the bill. Attention please, final reading of LB 312. Excuse me, final reading of LB 312.

CLERK: Engross Legislative Bill 312. Introduced by Senator Schmit of the 23rd district. (read) LB 312.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, members of the body, I request unanimous consent to have LB 545 held over, can I have it held over for a day or perhaps bracket it.

PRESIDENT: You can specify a time.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Why don't I just have it held over for a day. There may be some problem in it they may have to be corrected then.

PRESIDENT: Does the chair understand that you want to hold it over for a day, means that you will want it read tomorrow?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Well, I'd at least like the opportunity to check out the defects that has been brought, I'm not sure that it is a real defect, but if it is, I'd just like to have held until tomorrow, so that I have an opportunity to check that and if there is no problem, I'd like to have it read.

PRESIDENT: Stand by. The motion is then, Senator Cavanaugh is asking that 545 be held over for one day as the chair understands the motion. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I only have a suggestion, why don't you make it Wednesday of next week, because I'm hopeful that is when we'll adjourn too, but at that time, you will have plenty of time, you will not lose any position and generally Friday is a light day and I don't know how many is going to be here.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Well, the only thing is Senator, if there is no problem, I would just assume have it read Friday.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Cavanaugh asking unanimous consent then to hold 545 until tomorrow. Are there any
