SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move LB 315 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Now the motion is to advance LB 315 as amended. All those in favor of the motion please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, the bill as amended is advanced. Senator Goodrich, just a minute. Senator Goodrich, we're going to go on pass, come back here and catch you just a minute here. Let's go on 341 then.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of E & R amendments to LB 341.

PRESIDENT: Motion now is to adopt the amendments to 341. All those in favor of the motion, please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, the amendments are adopted.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move LB 341 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Motion now to advance 341. All those in favor of advancing the bill please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, the bill as amended is advanced.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of E & R amendments to LB 423.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to adopt the amendments to LB 423. All those in favor of the motion, please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, the amendments are adopted.

CLERK: All right now, Mr. President there are also amendments to 423 but the bill must be advanced then returned.

PRESIDENT: All right.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move LB 423 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Motion now is to advanced LB 423 as amended. All those in favor of advancing the bill please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered the bill as amended is advanced. Ok, we'll pick up 315 first. 172, the E & R amendments have been adopted and it has been laid over.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is now an amendment offered by Senator Carpenter on 172.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, the amendment has the effect of attempting to compromise what I understand is the main difficulty that is now confined to bills, and that it does not now limit the expenditures on the local level.
