

the 1970 Governatorial races the reports show that the Tieman committee spend a \$108,000 in the...and the Exon committee spend just shy of \$30,000 in the primaries the expenditures ran up to \$125,000 and \$133,000. I don't think that a hundred thousand limit would be unreasonable in terms of the history of campaign spending and more importantly I think that we would be starting with the principle of a reasonable limitation.

PRESIDENT: Any further, Senator Lewis, then Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR LEWIS: I would like to have those numbers on that primary again, particularly for that Burbach campaign. I would like to get those.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move to amend his motion and to allow the Lt. Governor to spend the same \$100,000 not the same but an additional \$100,000. I think that maybe I can raise that.

PRESIDENT: The amendment before us now is to amend the Fellman motion then to include the Lt. Governor to be able to spend a hundred thousand dollars in the same campaign. Are there any objections...excuse me, are there any further discussion? All those in favor of that amendment please say aye, those opposed say no. Ayes have it so ordered, that amendment is adopted to the Fellman amendment. Well we will take a machine vote Senator Fellman if you want one, you can ask for that. What do you want, do you want a machine vote? Alright all those in favor of the Carpenter amendment vote aye, those opposed vote no. Senator Fellman I suppose I should just mention that I have very discerning ears. Have you all voted? This is a vote on the Carpenter amendment, to the Fellman amendment. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 16 Ayes, 8 Nays.

PRESIDENT: As mentioned before the amendment is adopted. Now Senator Fellman back to you to the amendment as amended.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Mr. President, members of the legislature what we now do if this amendment is passed is that we have passed a campaign spending limit of \$200,000 for the General Election in 1974 since the Governor and Lt. Governor run as a ticket. I ask unanimous consent to withdraw the motion for this....

PRESIDENT: I don't think that you can now that it has been amended. The Chair would not allow that. Sorry Senator Fellman.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Now I can do it.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the amendment be adopted? All those in favor ...excuse me Senator Whitney do you wish to be heard on this issue? Senator Proud? We have the Fellman amendment as amended by Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR PROUD: Well were voting on the Carpenter amendment as amended right?

PRESIDENT: No the Fellman amendment as amended. Alright all those in favor of the amendment vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.
