SENATOR MARVEL: You mean in the other bill or in the first part of this bill?

SENATOR CARPENTER: When he sent in 259, he indicated after he sent it in he needed some more amendments which...

SENATOR MARVEL: \$3...

SENATOR CARPENTER: How much?

SENATOR MARVEL: \$366,105.

SENATOR CARPENTER: And then, how much money does this require?

SENATOR MARVEL: This requires in addition to that \$366,105, \$241,169 or a total of \$607,274.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now what was this additional amount required for?

SENATOR MARVEL: OK. Now, I'll go into this now if you would like. There are about fifteen items. The first one has to do with the District Courts which has to do with the District Judges and the Reporters, adding about \$11,700. Secondly, the Secretary of States office having to do with the wrapping and binding of statutes for reports, \$2,000. Large items from the Department of Agriculture reducing the enforcement of standards for Dairy Food and Drugs and the Plant Industry and adding those reductions which amount to about \$47,000 to basically brucellosis payments. The raising of a cash ceiling for Securities Enforcement in the Department of Banking. The Depart...excuse me. Ok, I've got it now. There are three items, Senator Carpenter, in this budget that have to do with the maintenance of the new Laboratory which is shared by the Department of Health and the State Patrol and the Department of Agriculture. There are three items in here having to do with the Game and Parks and Natural Resources Commission which have to do with the lower Platte study. The \$150,000 which goes to the Med Center which Senator Savage can explain which has to do with, what's his, LB 1..what was it, Senator Savage, 102 was passed, which adds money for treatment of the handicapped at the Med Center. An additional amount of money goes for Public Employees Retirement, \$146,467, which, in effect, they left out money for the implementation of the pay plan and additional money for the Office of Clerk and Office of Reporter in the Supreme Court area, in the payment of two secretaries in Omaha under the state-wide probation system.

SENATOR CARPENTER: What did he cut down, for example, and take out of his original request, if any, in order to make up part of the addition he is asking for?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well, he cut down, basically, in the area of Mental Health. He cut down..would you like the exact figures? \$82,599, he took off of the Mental Health Program. And off of Public Assistance, he took \$158,570.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, now, in the discussion, those who were there representing him, did they give any reason for the reduction of these items in order to offset a part of the increase he asked for?

SENATOR MARVEL: Senator Carpenter, this was the question that was asked and this is where the answer from the Governor's staff that they attempted to refute on the floor that they did it on the basis of slight of hand.
