CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

PRESIDENT: Roll Call.

CLERK: Senator Fellman asks to be excused until he arrives, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Have you all indicated your presence? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Are there corrections for the Journal?

CLERK: Reads. That's all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections from the floor? Hearing none then, the Journal will stand as corrected. Do we have any notices of committee hearings or reports?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: We have no Final Reading for today. That moves us on, are there resolutions on the desk?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Are there any bills for introduction?

CLERK: Fortunately none.

PRESIDENT: Well, we have two bills for consideration on Select File. No comment.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 562, the E & R amendments were adopted as of yesterday, there was a request to hold the bill over. There is presently pending an amendment offered by Senator Carpenter. Reads amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: This amendment was given to me by people who indicated they represented both the Republican and the Democratic party and this has the effect of making the list of the voters available on a basis more easily obtained than now and both parties indicate they are having a great deal of difficulty getting copies of the voting lists in all the precincts of the counties of the state and this is the purpose of this amendment. I ask for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the amendment? Question is, shall the--any further discussion of the bill? Senator Stromer.

SENATOR STROMER: Mr. President, I would just only add that I think that the amendment's okay. I think that it has been discussed with both groups of people that would be interested and I think we should move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the amendment? Question is, shall the amendment be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Senator Waldron, did you want to be heard? Voting on the Carpenter amendment to LB 562 on Select File. Voting on the Carpenter amendment. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, Mr. President.
