

to E & R Initial. I am just going to repeat myself. This is the bill which merely mechanically transfers these items from the Department of Institutions to the Department of Corrections or Correctional Services. That's all it does, there's no additional fiscal impact for the coming year.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill? Question is, shall LB 563A be advanced from General File to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 2 nays, 17 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Bill is advanced. Brings up for General File debate LB 134.

CLERK: Reads title of LB 134. There are voluminous committee amendments which strike the original bill. Signed, Senator Waldron, chairman.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. Chairman, I move the Committee amendments be rejected. We don't have time this session to adopt the committee amendments I don't believe. This is an established and elaborate procedure for rules and regulations of the State of Nebraska but there are parts of the bill which are needed which are noncontroversial and the committee amendments are controversial and so I move that we reject the committee amendments so Senator Duis can get the part of this bill that he needs to hold hearings on rules and regulations this summer. So I move the committee amendments be rejected.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion? All right, the motion is to reject the Standing Committee amendments to LB 134. All those in favor of the motion say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, Standing Committee amendments then are rejected. Senator Duis.

CLERK: All right, now Mr. President, there are a series of amendments. The first one is offered by Senator Waldron. Reads amendment.

SENATOR WALDRON: I ask unanimous consent to withdraw any amendments I have on the bill because they were to the original bill.

PRESIDENT: Any objections to withdrawal of Senator Waldron's amendments? Hearing none, so ordered. The amendments are withdrawn.

CLERK: Okay, the next amendment is offered by Senator Cavanaugh. Reads amendments.
