PRESIDENT: Motion is to advance LB 526. Are you in accord now, Senator Duis? Any further discussion? Question is, shall 526 then be advanced from General File to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will, whoops, stand by just a minute. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, no nays, 20 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Bill is advanced. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Are there any committee amendments to 529?

SENATOR BURBACH: I move for the adoption of the Standing Committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to adopt the Standing Committee amendments. Better read the title of the bill.

SENATOR BURBACH: The amendments provide certain conditions under which motor vehicles...

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach, just a minute, we'd better read the title here first. It's a constitutional restriction.

CLERK: Reads title of LB 529.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. Chairman, the committee amendments have to do with a present law provides that motor vehicles may not qualify as occasional sales. The amendment provides certain conditions under which motor vehicles can be classified as occasional sales. This is in the case of Chapter S corporation. There is one other amendment of consequence which has to do with hospitals or homes for the aged and infirmed persons. I move for the adoption of the Standing Committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted? All those in favor please say aye, those opposed say no. Committee amendments are adopted.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Move the bill be advanced to E & R for Initial.

PRESIDENT: Motion now is to advance LB 529 from General File to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Moving 529 as amended from General File. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Next is 530. Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Reads title of LB 530.

PRESIDENT: Are there committee amendments?

CLERK: There are committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: I move the adoption of the Standing Committee amendments. The bill as amended will also provide for contracts between the counties and the Tax Commissioner for the joint conduct of an appraisal and that joint contact will be at the option of the county. If you recall, last year we extended in giving moratorium to 8 counties to wait one year before they had to have their scientific appraisal and we must act on this bill this year because those eight counties will then have their
