PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, has asked unanimous consent to take up 586. Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. We'll take the bill up. Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: LB 586, introduced by miscellaneous subjects committee, (Read)

SENATOR WARNER: All right, I move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT: Are there any committee amendments.

CLERK: None, there is no amendments of any kind.

PRESIDENT: Question is, shall 586 be advanced from general file to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The bill is being advanced from general file, 586. Advancing 586. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, no nays, 23 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Chair recognizes Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, members of the body, I've had two bills on the top of general file for about 3 weeks. I would like to skip over them though, as important as they may be to me and ask that LB 387 which is to create a foreign trade zone of the US department of commerce in Omaha, be advanced off of general file. I ask this because I have had 2 bills on general file that have been surpassed several times in the last 3 weeks.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to considering the bill. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: First I would like to make a brief statement. I was the one who held the bill up. Since that time, I've hassled with the Senator from Omaha, the old Mayor of the Omaha and the man who I hope will be the new mayor and the Chamber of Commerce. Everybody is in agreement and I am so I hope you will be with us Senator--.

PRESIDENT: Any objections to considering 387? So ordered. The clerk will read the title.

CLERK: LB 387 introduced by Senator Snyder of the 14th district (Read) There are committee amendments by Senator Luedtke, judiciary committee, (Read)

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments.

CLERK: A committee amendment was offered by Senator Carpenter and it straightens out language as far as multi-state or bi-state or inter-state operation goes and I'd let Senator Snyder talk to this when he discusses the bill, but I would move the adoption of the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the committee amendments? Senator Snyder, you want to discuss the committee amendment? Question is, shall the committee amendment be adopted? All those in favor, say aye, those opposed say no. The committee amendments are adopted.
