

manufactured, or otherwise processed without any customs duties being accessed by the U.S. customs officials until the goods are shipped from the zone. There are customs paid at the time of shipping. That is brief. I think everybody is familiar with the term. Mr. President, I now move that LB 387 as amended be advanced from general file to E & R initial.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion of 387? Senator Duis, Senator Kremer, do you want to discuss 387? Ok. Question is shall 387 be advanced from general file to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Now sooner or later we were going to get into a jam here because we were taking up Senator Schmit's 261 and Senator Kremer, for what purpose did you want to be recognized?

SENATOR KREMER: Is 261 up next?

PRESIDENT: Well, that is what we were trying to do and in the meantime because he stepped out, why he gave the floor to Senator Stahmer. He yielded the floor to Senator Stahmer for his bill. Now he is missing again. Just a second, I am trying to find, what his intent it. I don't know what, but we had agreed earlier by unanimous consent to take up 261 after 587. Now, all right let's go back here to Senator Duis for just a minute then. Senator Duis was up also Senator Kremer. Stand by I'll come back to you.

SENATOR DUIS: Well, Mr. President, in order that we might regain composure here and also relax just a moment. I did want to tell you that I will make a motion tomorrow morning, so that we won't be too concerned about taking bills from general file to select file. The motion I will make tomorrow morning will be to suspend the rules, that the bills on select file will be taken up in the same manner as if they were on general file and that will relieve the tension here so that you know that you will have an opportunity to take care, we are merely trying to save a days time here. Thank-you very much Mr. President. Because I think this, we should do.

PRESIDENT: All right now, Senator Kremer, back to you for your motion. Wait just a minute, maybe I can clarify Senator Schmit, what is your intent now on 261. You yielded the floor to Senator Stahmer, we've had a series now of things go on. Do you still want to take up 261?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, I will take it Mr. President, if it is agreeable with the chair.

PRESIDENT: Did you hear the discussion by Senator Duis? Regarding suspension of the rules tomorrow in order to take care of the bill in the same way in which they are handled on general file today on select file after the bills are moved on. Ok.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes I did.

PRESIDENT: Back to you. All right, the clerk will read the title to 261 unless it has been read.

CLERK: LB 261 (Read) There are a, committee amendments by Senator Luedtke, judiciary committee.
