

take up 306A, this has been waiting at this location right next for about 3 weeks now on general file. 306 is on final reading and I ask that we move 306A off of general file.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to consider 306A. Are there objections to considering the bill? Hearing none, so ordered. Clerk will read LB, the title of 306A.

CLERK: 306A, introduced by Senator Marsh (Read) There are no amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, are there committee--

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, the intent of LB 306, I move the LB 306A be advanced to E & R initial.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill? Question is, shall 306A be advanced from general file to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Voting on advancement of 306A. Thank-you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion is advanced. Senator Rasmussen was next. Then Cavanaugh, then Anderson.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I'd like to bring up 378. This bill was on final reading. We gutted it. The amendments now are the bill and it conforms with the Federal regulations on synthetic foods, which becomes effective January 1, 1974.

PRESIDENT: 378. Senator Rasmussen asking unanimous consent to consider 378. Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. The clerk will read the title. I guess it has been read.

CLERK: Mr. President, we don't have a bill. We're not sure if the committee ever reported the bill back to us on it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rasmussen, we can't find your 378. Do you know where it is at? Senator Rasmussen, we can't find 378. Do you know where it is at? Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, the bill was amended in committee and the clerk, my clerk has reported to the clerk of the legislature.

CLERK: We have the report, but not the bill itself. We have your report, saying your reporting it back to the legislature, but we don't have the bill.

SENATOR SCHMIT: The amendment is the bill.

PRESIDENT: Switch to Senator Duis over here, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: While they are doing that, I was just going to try to get another bill while they are working on that.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, I can explain the amendment if you would like.

PRESIDENT: All right, let's try it.
