

be identified in display cases, because it substantially changes the bill, it went back to the committee for a hearing. At that time, it was determined that there were two different subject matters in the bill, so we struck the original matter of 378 and the bill now only contains the amendment, which is that any synthetic product that is offered for sale, must be identified as such in the display case and in order that it not be in conflict with federal regulations, the committee redrafted the amendment so that it conforms with the federal requirements and the in the food act. Under this act, the department of agriculture has the authority to supervise and inspect the retail outlets so that the public interest is protected. That is all that it does. I think it is a good amendment and a good bill and should be advanced.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the committee amendments to 378? All those in favor of adopting the committee amendments please say aye. Those opposed say no. The committee amendments are adopted. All right, we'll move the bill on Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I move that the bill be moved on to E & R.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 378 as amended by the committee amendments from general file to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, no nays, 18 not voting. Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right now, I'm trying to honor what lights were on and I have two more and then I'm going to announce something else. So Senator Cavanaugh, we'll see if we can get to you and then we have apparently something. Senator Cavanaugh, then Senator Anderson. Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I request unanimous consent to take up LB 524. This pertains to the State Parole board to increase membership from 3 to 5 and to make 3 full time members. This increase was provided for in the Governor's budget and it is greatly needed because of the increased work load of the parole board.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Cavanaugh asking unanimous consent to consider 524. Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Clerk will read the bill, title.

CLERK: LB 524, introduced by Senator Cavanaugh (Read) There are committee amendments by Senator Luedtke, judiciary committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments. The committee amendments actually constitutes the bill and I might just tell you that the Governor introduced this bill and the judiciary committee also introduced this bill. It is a very important part of our penal correctional reform package and we got together and worked out any differences there were with the Governor's office and this is the amendment to the bill and I would move that the amendments be adopted and that Senator Cavanaugh explain the total bill which is the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the committee amendments? Question is, shall the committee amendments of 524 be adopted? All those in favor, please say aye, all those opposed say no. The committee amendments are adopted. Back to you Senator Cavanaugh.
