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anything about them until we get into that position.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Is it your intent then that the A bills on E & R initial would also be included in this group when we get the final reading.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, if we get to final reading for example, which I presume they probably will, I would think it would take the natural course. Now if you want to pass these over until they all get there, why I have no objection, but I think now we don't have much else before us. These could take some time in order to discuss. They do result in a certain amount of expenditure of the public's money.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Now, Senator Carpenter, are you going to be in favor of this motion, when you vote?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes, I'm going to vote for every A bill up there.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Well Senator Carpenter, I'd like for you to include in your motion also the A bills on E & R engrossing that when they get to final reading.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I don't see how I can do that because I can't do anything to bind the body until we get there.

PRESIDENT: And the chair would so rule.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Ok.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have no desire not to read it, but we can't do it from the mechanical standpoint. Now it is my understanding Senator while we're talking, that the Mr. Emory is pretty well snowed under. We passed a lot more bills off of general file than he anticipated. I understand he is going to have some trouble. How much I do not know, in order to get the thing which is so mechanized and get all these bills on E & R initial over to select file. I don't they will be there much before tomorrow morning and Senator Duis has a motion to consider those bills on select file in that position under the rules that generally prevail under general file, which I presume this body, would and should pass.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Well, I would feel then that we should have a gentlemen's agreement that when these get from E & R engrossing over to final reading, that they would be read too.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I'm sure they will be.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Ok, thank-you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion? Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I, the only thing that I question on this motion is the fact that some of these are very expensive bills and I would hate to see the bill passed and then not be an A bill and I wonder if it would be possible we could reverse the position and read the A bill first, to see if we are going to go along with the expenditure and money and I don't want something on the books, that says we have to do so and so and we are not willing to pay for it.

PRESIDENT: Well, under those circumstances, the chair would accept a motion then to suspend the rules, because I think you would have to do that. The rules call for it to be reversed and I have, Senator Carpenter.
