SENATOR LUEDTKE: As soon as I get away.

SPEAKER: Oh, all right. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: A question of Senator Luedtke, if he's got..if he's staying so available.

SPEAKER: Senator Luedtke is trying to get an amendment for us.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Go ahead.

SENATOR BARNETT: I had to agree..I am sorry my good friend from Lincoln but I have to agree a little bit with Senator Burbach and you say they weren't talking about these things. I understand they were talking about them and if that is not the case, how much money do you think it is going to cost to put them additions on there that you are talking about.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: It will cost considerably more than one and a half million dollars. I don't know.

SENATOR BARNETT: What do you base that figure on.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Base that figure on the first estimate of the building, of this building with the full olympic size pool that we're talking about which was about eighteen million dollars.

SENATOR BARNETT: In this first part of this Resolution, you have under there a number 1 and it says to be used solely to provide the following. Now if there isn't funds there to do it, you couldn't very well provide it could you.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: That's specifically what I am saying that they cannot do all this with those Senator.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, then, I don't see why we need the amendment that you are talking about then. If they don't have the funds, you can't provide it.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: There is written into this Resolution the implication that we can do this and that we will get additional funds to do it if this does not provide it and I agree with that. However, I want to make it very certain that the additional funds will be there, the private donations will be there before we proceed to try to raise the roof and provide a 10 meter diving board and all that because that's going to cause..you have to.. first of all you have to change the whole plans of the building to do this.

SENATOR BARNETT: I think they are doing that now, aren't they?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: They did not plan to completely expand out. They'd have to change the very location of the building as I read this.

SENATOR BARNETT: I guess I don't understand it the way you do then.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well I have followed this for quite some time. I think I understand it.

SPEAKER: All right. Is there any..any further discussion. If not, we will stand at ease a few moments while Senator Luedtke gets his amendment prepared.

SENATOR CARPENTER: A point of order while we are resting. What can we do when we dispose of this?
