Clerk reading.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with the question is shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Voting on the final passage of LB 538 with the emergency clause. Once again have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Senator Proud voting aye. Vote read. 36 ayes, no nays, 13 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. Getting seated in the North Balcony are 28 boys and 6 adults from Cub Pack 43. Their Scoutmaster is Dick Jessel from Senator Stromer's district out there in Kearney, Nebraska and we're just very pleased that you have come to the capitol city in order to see the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature in action. We're on final reading and that's the reason that there won't be any floor activity, at least for the present time, but if you watch the board up behind me, you can see the number of the bill up there that's being read. The constitutional requirements are that each bill be read in its entirety so that's the reason for the quietness on the floor here at this present time. Final bill on final reading this morning, at least the schedule that the Chair has been supplied, is LB 588. Attention please, the final reading of LB 588.

CLERK: Reads bill.

LB 588

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Vote read.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Duis voting aye. 41 ayes, no nays, 8 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. Now, Senator Barnett, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I would like to ask unanimous consent to read LB 585. I realize it has an appropriation, if it's a little bit unusual to pass over this one, it's for the slain trooper's wife. I'd like to ask unanimous consent to read LB 585. We asked to have that expedited.

PRESIDENT: The Chair would rule that you can't do it by unanimous consent but you certainly can make a motion.

SENATOR BARNETT: I'd make a motion then, I'd so move.

PRESIDENT: That's fine. This would undo, you see, another procedure that's already been adopted by the Legislature and it would take a motion to do that. Senator Carpenter, do you want to speak to the motion?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Just to make a notice that the Executive Council will not meet this noon. They'll meet sometime next week.
