

CLERK 25 ayes Mr. President, on a motion to return.

PRESIDENT: Bill is returned, Senator Luedtke back to you.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I would move then the adoption of the amendment to 563. The only additional thing I would say, is that it also then would wipe out any reference to the crerectional services commission which we have already amended out of the bill and that should have been amended out also, and it would leave this director then as an appointee of the Governor, treated like any other appointee of the Governor to be confirmed by the legislature.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion? Question then is, shall the amendment be adopted to 563 on select file? All those in favor, vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Amendment is adopted. Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I move that it be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Motion now, is to readvance LB 563 as amended. All those in favor of readvancing the bill as amended please say aye, those opposed say no. Very good. The bill is readvanced.

CLERK: Now Mr. President, we have a motion by Senator Maresh to return LB 256 for select file for specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Chair recognizes Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, members of the legislature, this amendment has to do with reinstating \$246,940 for a cottage at the youth development center at Geneva. This was in the Governor's bill and was not in the budget bill when he came back to the floor and now this would also take care of the demolition of a old cottage which is a fire trap they tell me and I feel that this is very much needed. We don't want to expose these youngsters out there to this fire hazard. So I move that LB 256 be returned to select file for this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I only suggest, and it is only a suggestion, you had better leave this bill alone. You get it back on select file, all hell can break loose. Senator Maresh has his chance the other day and he didn't react to it. I called it to Senator Chambers attention and I don't care what they do. I'm just saying you get it back there, you could open alot of things and you could get into a lot of trouble. Now do as you please.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, I had to leave early that evening. I had some equipment that was broken and I had the amendment in twice, but then I had to leave, so I thought I better, we would go to on select file, that is why it was left till now.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke, then Senator Marvel.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I would just like to say that this particular building was not recommended as any priority item in the penal correctional area. It is something with the vast changes that we are proposing in the area of correctional reform that we may not need any of these buildings and our advisors, the professional advisors did not advise immediate building or of these particular buildings. If there is some danger of fire or anything of that kind, these children can be place else where.
