SENATOR CARPENTER: Well all I'm saying that the bill as it now is, do you dispute this bill is not what they want. Make the distinction between what you want and what they want.

SENATOR KELLY: Well that is kind of like, your still beating your wife.

SENATOR CARPENTER: No it isn't, it is just asking--

SENATOR KELLY: The university is entitled to change their minds. Now it would appear to me that they made a major shift in their mind changing in a matter of 6 weeks.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well you contend that they can't change their mind?

SENATOR KELLY: No sir, I've seen them change their minds many times.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Ok, thank-you.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: Mr. President, members of the legislature, as one of the co-sponsors of this bill, I would have to oppose this motion. The Goodrich amendment has worked out as a compromise between several different factions, it is acceptable to the University. The language in the bill is permissive, so the things that were added are not going to create any new programs without providing funding by the legislature. So I don't see that it is a serious threat that Senator Kelly sees it as. It is acceptable to the university and the people who have backed the bill and worked with it. So I'd oppose this motion.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the motion. Question is, shall the, excuse me, Senator Kelly do you want to close on your motion? Any closing? Chair recognizes Senator Kelly for closing. He is now closing.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the body, basically the difference in these two amendments is that the university of Nebraska in open session did not ask for the rural health studies college. Now in the committee amendment and in the Carpenter amendment, excuse me, the Goodrich amendment, that the architectural college and the engineering college are the same in both amendments. The committee amendment and the Goodrich amendment.

PRESIDENT: Question is, shall LB 275 be returned to select file, I believe the motion was, to strike the Goodrich amendment and reinstitute the other language. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Once again,
