

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the Lewis amendment be adopted, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. You are voting on the adoption of the Lewis amendment to the Carpenter motion relating to Hiram Scott College. Have you all voted. Clerk will record. I am sorry Senator Duis, Senator Duis voting aye.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, and 21 not voting.

PRESIDENT: It was just for the amendment, Senator Duis, the Lewis amendment. Alright, now you have the Carpenter amendment as amended by the Lewis amendment, excuse me, the Carpenter motion as amended by the Lewis amendment. Is there need for further discussion now of that motion. Alright, I had three lights pop on all at once, lets try Senator Stull, and then Senator Kelly, and then Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Carpenter a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, will you yield.

SENATOR STULL: Senator Carpenter, in the second line it says certain properties and then in the fourth line, such properties are to be free and clear of all encumbrances. Now, I would like for you to tell us does this include the library science complex at the Hiram Scott facility?

SENATOR CARPENTER: No, the Science building is owned really by the Federal government who has a mortgage of some approximately 1 1/2 million against it and they have a reason to believe that the federal government, if eventually this building is given to the University and it has to be given only to the University according to the information that I have, then the Federal government will forgive the mortgage and then give that building to them free for all encumbrances. That is not covered in this bill.

SENATOR STULL: Then the other thing that this does not include the dormitories either?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I can say absolutely that there is no desire and neither to this motion nor did any bill every have the desire to give the dormitory to the state of Nebraska.

SENATOR STULL: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly? And then Senator Kennedy, speaking on the Carpenter motion relating to Hiram Scott College as amended by the Richard Lewis amendment.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President and members of the body, we have been hearing of Hiram Scott all through this session. Back to 197 when we had an amendment that would allow the University of Nebraska to lease property obviously 179, obviously LB275 with the Carpenter amendment to change the colleges that the University originally asked for. Obviously in a supplemental appropriation bill of an extra \$300,000 for the medical college and now the gift resolution in which we would receive a gift that we are not going to do anything with which obviously I am sure that none of us accept that we are not going to do something with it. This is obvious by the Lewis amendment to immediately restrict one small section of post high school education at Curtis College. It would appear to me that expansion of the University of Nebraska into what I consider
