I think it ought to be kept for what it's now being used for from the limited knowledge I have plus, I think there are other things that maybe some of these facilities such as dormitories, can be used for which are not pertinent to the field of education. For that reason I ask the passage of the motion.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Wiltse.

SENATOR WILTSE: Mr. Chairman, I'd like to amend the motion to have included on the committee the State Senator that represents the respective district in which there is a state college.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I would have no--I think it's highly desirable.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Are there any objections to the amendment? Alright then, we'll have the motion amended to include the State Senators from the district which represents the college. Is there any further discussion of the motion? Question is shall the motion--do you all understand the motion? Question is shall the Carpenter motion regarding the study of Peru State College which would include on the group--with the group studying it, the State Senator representing that district? All those in favor of the motion vote aye. Yes, yes, whichever district--the college. The motion would include, including the Senator from each of the districts which are represented by the, which represent the colleges.

SENATOR WILTSE: In which there is a state college.

PRESIDENT: In which there is a state college. Thank you, Senator Wiltse.

SENATOR CARPENTER: In this case, why don't we be specific and say Senator Wiltse. It's his responsibility and he should be there and it's up to him to look after these people's interest. I amend his motion to strike it and insert Senator Wiltse.

PRESIDENT: Alright, are there objections to that? Senator Wiltse, you're now included. Okay, all those in favor of the motion vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, no nays, on the motion.

PRESIDENT: Motion is adopted. Do we have another motion on the desk?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes, there's another one up there.

PRESIDENT: Thank you.

CLERK: The second motion is (reads).
