SPEAKER: Are you making that in the form of a motion, Senator?

: I will second that motion.

SPEAKER: Senator Duis. I think we're involved here in the change of the rules. The clerk thinks there is a rule on this. But, I suggest to you and Senator Carpenter get together, and you come up with something tomorrow. But I think right now we ought to dispose of this bill one way or the other. If this requires a rule change, why we can suspend the rules and adopt whatever we want, but I think rather than get into a long discussion on this that that can be taken up tomorrow. What do you think Senator Carpenter?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I think we ought to move the bill along, and the Legislature some time will adopt the procedure as to the method which would be considered on the final reading.

SPEAKER: O.K. Senator Dickinson

SENATOR DICKINSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. I haven't been able to hear all of the conversation down in front. The sound isn't working too well. I think there's a lot of things involved in this bill that are left unanswered. And for instance, Senator Snyder I hope you are listening to this, the limitation does not apply, the limitation of paying a parent transporting only one child, or transporting more than one child does not apply unless you get over the \$450. In other words if you live fairly close to the point where you are taking the youngster. You could haul 5 or 6 children in one vehicle and get paid mileage for all. As long as you didn't exceed the \$450. This would happen in many cases. I think there's a lot of things that need to be decided. We need to correlate the effects of LB403, and what's it's going to do for these same children. So, with this in mind, I move that we bracket this bill until some day next week. To give everybody a chance to see what's going on.

SPEAKER: Now the motion has been made to bracket, till you say Wednesday of next week?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Yes

SPEAKER: ALL RIGHT. Does anybody wish to speak to that motion. Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Just one quick comment, Mr. Speaker. I'm not opposed to bracketing, as I said. I hope that the body has paid attention to this discussion. To the standpoint that Senator Carpenter has explained. We're trying to also use this as an instrument to determine what our priorities are going to be, and how we're going to handle fiscal matters. One additional point on the particular bill. When the original legislation was brought up, I believe it was 2 years ago. From the testimony from that public hearing and from the comment that I have heard from people who are affected very directly by this legislation. They left the public hearing and when the bill was passed two years ago, it was their understanding, all parents were going to be included in this legislation. They were not. It is in that sense remedial legislation that we are attempting here at the same time. All right that's it for LB92. I'm agreeable to Senator Dickinson's date of..next Wednesday..any date that you want to say is all right.

SPEAKER: Next Wednesday. Senator Kennedy, do you have any objections to that?

SENATOR KENNEDY: No. And I will make an effort to get the cost of the bill at that time. I think that is very good. Let's bracket it till next Wednesday.
