PRESIDENT: No. Can you hold your questions then until we dispose of whether or not this bill is even going to be argued or not. It appears proper that at this time this bill should be laid over Senator Whitney has raised an objection in essence by filing or asking for a unanimous consent motion. But you really shouldn't need a motion in order to call to the chair's attention that it's out of order to hear the bill when there is no fiscal note attached. So the chair is going to rule, Senator Barnett, that at this time we'll pass over LB502 and the amendments that were discussed. Because there is not a fiscal note attached as the rules of the Legislature require. Now then. That's the way it is. Senator Lewis do you want to appeal from the ruling of the chair?

SENATOR LEWIS: No. Mr. President I would make a request that's germane to this particular bill, if I may.

PRESIDENT: Certainly.

SENATOR LEWIS: There are currently some costs involved in the public defender on the role providing counsel for those that do not have the resources available to do that. In the fiscal note I would like for that to be reflected, Senator Luedtke, if we could to show that some of this cost that we're talking in terms of its replacement money costs for rent that we're already providing on a fee or appointed basis currently. I hope that will be reflected. Be in the cost of the program.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis what is your objection? Excuse me. Senator Kelly what is your objection.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I think that's wrong for me not to be able to ask my questions when other members make speeches on the same bill.

PRESIDENT: Well, we're going to lay over LB502 and there won't be any more question of that. LB502 is laid over. Move on the consideration of LB434. To Senator Waldron's bill.

CLERK: Mr. President we have a request to lay over 434 until Friday, January 4.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to lay over LB434. Are there objections to laying it over..is that until Friday?

CLERK; Yes.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Are there objections. There are none. So ordered the bill is laid over until Friday. Brings up next LB78 Senator Clark's bill.

CLERK: How about 490?

PRESIDENT: Excuse me.LB490 is next on General File. Senator Kremer are you ready to take up LB490. Or what's your pleasure.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr.Chairman. LB490 has to do with allowing of highway signs to remain in place until such times the federal funds are available to disassemble them. However, this is the bill that was introduced last year, and now there has been some new regulations coming out of Washington and we do not know yet what they are, so we'll have to hold this bill over until we get that information. So I ask unanimous consent to hold it over indefinitely until we get that information.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer asking unanimous consent to holdover 490 indefinitely until further information is received. Are there objections to holding the bill over. Hearing none. So ordered 490 is held over. We'll move on then to LB78.
