SENATOR RICHENDIFER: OK, so granted.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richendifer are you withdrawing your motion then?

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richendifer is asking unanimous consent to withdraw his unanimous consent motion, are there objections? Hearing non, so ordered. It is withdrawn. Move on to the general file consideration of LB471. Senator Warner are you prepared to take up LB471 at this time or do you want..

CLERK: There was a request Mr. President to bracket. I thought that maybe that was from last year. But this is a fresh request. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to bracket LB471. Are there objections to bracketing the bill? Hearing none so ordered. 471 is bracketed. Move to the consideration of LB48.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to bracket LB48 until January 21, 1974, signed Senator Stahmer.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to bracket LB48 until January 21st. Are there objections to bracketing LB48 until January 21? Hearing none it is so ordered. Move on then to the General File consideration of LB432. Chair recognizes Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: That is my bill Mr. President and there is no fiscal note attached there therefore I ask that the chair lay it over.

PRESIDENT: 432? Senator Whitney, now we are talking about the same bill right?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Yes.

PRESIDENT: OK, any objection to holding over 432, there is not a fiscal note on it. Hearing none so ordered. The bill is held over. Next to consider then is LB212. Senator Waldron. Senator Waldron in the Chambers? Stand by I think that the Sargent of Arms went out to see if he could locate Senator Waldron. Senator Waldron in the Chamber, did you locate him? Well we will pass over LB212. That brings up 293 then. That is Senator Simpsons bill.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, I would like to pass over 293 we have been working on some amendments and I just received a copy of them within the last hour and we would like to go over them before we would take this up. So if we could pass it for several days it would be appropriate I believe.

PRESIDENT: Any objections to passing over the bill? Hearing none so ordered. General File consideration of 334. Senator Cavanaugh are you ready to take up 334? Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I would like to have that passed for a few days.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Cavanaugh asking to have 334 passed over. Any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Try 66.
