CHAPLAIN: Prayer given.

PRESIDENT: Roll call.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Stahmer asked to be excused today. Senator Fellman asked to be excused today. Senator Waldron asked to be excused until 10:30 and Senator Warner and Kelly arrives.

PRESIDENT: Any objections. Hearing none. So ordered. Once again we are asking you to indicate your presence. Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Are there corrections for the Journal.

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Excellent. Any petitions or memorials.

CLERK: A communication from the Executive Office, Mr. President. (read) Communication from Nebraska Educational Television Network. On file in Clerk's office. Mr. President your Committee on Enrollment and Review has examined and reviewed LB 396 and recommend it be placed in Select File as amended. LB 92 on Select File as amended, 610 on Slect File and 695 Select File as amended (Signed) John Cavanaugh, Chairman. Notice of committee hearings (in Journal) That's all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Well the chair appreciates the fact that you cleaned up a Final Reading yesterday. There's no Final Reading for today. For that I say thank you. Are there resolutions on the desk.

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Do we have nay bills for introduction?

CLERK: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Stand by.

CLERK: Mr. President we have two bills to introduce, but the motion is by Senator Waldron, Chairman of Miscellaneous who is excused this morning, and the vice chairman is Senator Cavanaugh, who hasn't arrived,

PRESIDENT: Well, hold them over.

CLERK: O.K. Senator Carpenter will make the motion. I move the rules be suspended and that the attached bills be introduced. The bills are signed by the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee. One of the bills relates to the National Guard, to change what person shall be subject to duty in the National Guard. The other bill relates to Colleges and Universities who write a tuition credit for members of the National Guard.
