

to be sure and have the reading of the bill some people are in here that have not read it and said that they would have it done by tomorrow, I think that if we have some minor differences on the bill that you and I can talk about in the progress of the bill we could still make those changes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Not less than a half hour ago, or maybe an hour ago you and I both decided to have the conference on this thing Monday evening. Well then what is the matter with holding this bill until Tuesday? I move to amend his request to Tuesday.

PRESIDENT: Well just object and we will have to go from there Senator Goodrich. That is fine. Do you object?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

PRESIDENT: That is fine, we lost that motion then. Senator Simpson back to you.

SENATOR SIMPSON: It really doesn't make that much difference to me that we should.....

PRESIDENT: What is your motion now?

SENATOR SIMPSON: I would ask unanimous consent to hold this bill until next Tuesday then.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson is now asking unanimous consent to hold 293 until next Tuesday. Does the Chair understand that you want to bracket it then for that particular day? Alright Senator Simpson asking to bracket 293 until Tuesday. Are there objections? Any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. 293 is bracketed until Tuesday. Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Now Mr. President, members of the Legislature I do have some pamphlets having to do with this bill as a it was drafted by the national conference on commissioners of these uniform state laws, so anyone that would wish a copy of this might want to look over a in short form just actually what the attempt of the bill was could have one they will be on my desk.

PRESIDENT: That moves to General File Debate LB680.

CLERK: Read 680

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this bill was suggested to me by a man named Woody Wodjure who works for the Grand Island Trust Company in Grand Island. He presented the idea to me on the basis that this would allow trust companies and banks to further compete with the personal loan companies and personal loans make more money available to the public by including the ability to take a lien on real estate a in negotiation of these loans. I move that we advance LB680 to E & R Initial.
