SENATOR BARNETT: I think that it looks like in some areas now they are not over in here but I think that Senator Rasmussen says that he has his. I would like to know who appeared for the bill and so forth. I would like to know something about it if somebody has something here.....

PRESIDENT: I'll let the Clerk...want the Clerk to read it to you Senator Barnett?

SENATOR BARNETT: Not the bill, the committee statement.

PRESIDENT: Committee statement, excuse me.

CLERK: Read statement.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill? Are you all through discussing the bill? Senator Carpenter do you have any closing on LB599? Senator Carpenter is now closing.

SENATOR CARPENTER: No closing.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall LB599 be advanced from General File to E & R Initial. All those in favor of advancing the bill will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Motion is to advance the bill general file 599. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Bill is advanced. That brings up for General File debate Senator Goodrich's LB653.

CLERK: Read LB653.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body this is a bill what we call a willing buyer, willing seller bill which says in essence that if you have a public entity say the University or even one of the other public entities that has the right of eminent domain if for example they need to acquire a piece of property. If they have a seller, they have negotiated the price, they have a willing buyer and a willing seller this bill would then say that they don't have to go through the public hearings or notice requirements if they have a willing buyer and a willing seller they can just go ahead and close the deal like any other transaction. That is really all the bill does and it is for that reason that it be moved to A..A.. that the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of 653? Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, I hate to rise all of the time, but I think that this is a bill that has a great deal of implications effect. Under the present law the law requires the area of condemnation, and certain procedures in order to
