PRESIDENT: We will come back to it later then.  
The chair recognizes Senator Carpenter. For what purpose do you rise, Senator?

SENATOR CARPENTER: For two purposes, Mr. President. The first to announce that the Executive Board will have a meeting at 1:00, this afternoon. The purpose of the meeting is to listen to the Fiscal Analyst's report to what he found out when he went to Washington with Mr. Peters the Tax Commissioner in the field of the energy crisis. I took it upon myself because the element of time to authorize his going to Washington and paying his expenses. I think what he has found, I think is very important to this body, at least to the board anyway and they will make up their own mind, I'm sure as to the extent they might want to project it. And I would hope that every member of the board could find time to come, and I don't think it will be a long meeting in that sense of the word. And I move to suspend the rules and attempt to pass the bills that are set for tomorrow today.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter's motion is to suspend the rules and take up the reading..the final reading of the bills set for tomorrow today. Is there any further discussion of his motion. The question is shall the rules be suspended on final reading for tomorrow be taken up today. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Vote on suspension of the rules to take the final reading of those bills today that were set for tomorrow. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The rules are suspended, we'll take up final reading today. Beginning with LR 19. As soon as we can clear the floor and get the Senators in their seats please. Excuse me. Senator Hasebroock for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Just wanted to inquire from the clerk what page LR 19 is in the Journal so I can find it.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Stand by.

CLERK: Probably page 242.

PRESIDENT: Legislative Resolution, the first act to consider here on Final Reading is found on page 242 of the Legislative Journal. The Chair is reluctant to do this, but Senator Stahmer I am going to have to ask you to take your seat please. We are ready for final reading. I must respectfully ask the other Senators to please get in their seats. Attention please, the Final Reading of LR 19

CLERK: LR 19(Read)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, 'Shall the resolution pass?' and be adopted. All those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. Once again the chair, we ask if you have all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 12 nays and 7 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted.
