PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion. We are discussing..Senator Proud did you want to be recognized again?

SENATOR PROUD: Well, I certainly am getting an education on the rules today. Senator Stahmer says that if you misplace a bill or it gets lost somewhere you can get it introduced. Well you can if you've got 30 votes up on that board. And when he asked for the introduction of this bill. I don't believe he explained it. But I voted to introduce it, which eliminates the school district I live in. But it is a little bit embarrassing and asked to explain my action by some school people, I said well, I just extended Senator Stahmer a courtesy. Had I known the contents of the bill my courtesy might not have extended that far. But anyhow, I agree with Senator Fellman, and if 4 or 5 Senators or whatever think this bill is important let's put it out here in the..on the floor to the committee and let's find out what it is all about because somebody with the name of Franklin Delano or something like that said we have nothing to fear but fear itself, or words to that affect. And so anything we've got down here that may have some merit let's get it out and take a look at it. Let's put in on the board and be done with it.

PRESIDENT: Now any further discussion of the motion to introduce the bill. Senator Cavanaugh do you have any closing? All right, Senator Cavanaugh is closing on his motion to introduce the bill.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: No, I wouldn't have any closing, other than I think everyone now is ready to extend the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee the same courtesy we extend to every other Committee. I think the Committee will appreciate that.

PRESIDENT: All right, the question is, Shall the bill be introduced, as explained by Senator Cavanaugh. All those in favor of the introduction of the bill vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is introduced. Do you want to read the title?

CLERK: LB989 (read)

Mr. President, there are notice of Committee hearings and Agriculture, Government, and Education as set bills for hearing.

PRESIDENT: Are there any other motions on the desk? O.K. We are ready then for consideration of bills on General File. Beginning today it looks like LB 327.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a request to lay 327 over again.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to lay 327 over until February 14th. Are there objections to laying the bill over until that time. Any objections. Hearing none. So ordered. The bill is laid over.
