SENATOR SYAS: Senator Carpenter accepted mine into his original motion.

PRESIDENT: O.K. Then the chair would so rule. With the exception of 104. I thought we could do it easier the other way but, fine. The chair would accept then the motion that we take up Final Reading today of tomorrow's business with the exception of LB 104. All those in favor of suspending the rules and taking up the Final Reading of LB 66 and 508 vote aye. All those opposed vote no. You are voting on suspending the rules to take up final reading today instead of tomorrow of LB 66 and 508. The chair would remind you that that takes 30 votes of course to suspend the rules and change the order here. Have you all voted? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I don't want to call for a Call of the House. We need 2 more votes to do this and I don't care whether we do it or not as far as I'm personally concerned.

PRESIDENT: The chair is not in a position to lobby for votes and to wait all day for you to vote. Have you all voted. The question is shall the rules be suspended the final reading be taken up today of LB 66 and 508. All right. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: O.K. The rules are suspended and we will take up Final Reading of LB 66.

CLERK: Mr. President can I complete the Committee Report.

PRESIDENT: Yes, please do.

CLERK: Mr. President your Standing Committee on Banking, Commerce and Insurance to whom has referred LB 672, instructs me to report the same legislative recommendation be indefinitely postponed. 714 indefinitely postponed. (Signed) Fred Carstens, Chairman. Mr. President, your Committee on Miscellaneous Subjects has set bills for hearing (Signed) Senator Waldron.
