PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Syas. Senator Chambers do you object to that?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I want to make something clear before we do it. Senator Syas's motion has been disposed of. Senator Savage's motion has been disposed of. And now they are dealing with Senator Snyder's motion. I want to make that clear so these two fish won't try to get into Senator Snyder's net.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Now, are there objections to Senator Snyder withdrawing that particular motion at this time and laying it over until we discuss that. Senator Savage for what purpose..

SENATOR SAVAGE: (inaudible)

PRESIDENT: Now what.

SENATOR SYAS: Senator Chambers indicated that I couldn't participate any more in this discussion. I'm going to come back with LB 900 next week to put it on a different twist.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That is clear, wouldn't that be a re-consideration. He could not act as though his effort was not defeated this morning. He would have to move to reconsider the action that the Legislature took this morning.

PRESIDENT: That's right. He's making a motion then, to reconsider the action. Just a minute. Stand by, just a minute. Senator Snyder's motion is still going to be pending when we come back next week. And then what happens from that point, etc., we'll tackle that thing one at a time. Now, Speaker Proud for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR PROUD: I call for the question to recess or whatever that is on the Clerk's desk.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Do we have any other business that we need..Senator Warner. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Has the Clerk..Vince have you read my committee yet..we are about to adjourn. I gave it to Vince didn't I?

PRESIDENT: Now, stand by. Because it is the Chair's under standing that we are not adjourning, we are recessing until 1:30. Is that the gist?

CLERK: That went earlier, Senator Warner, yes. Mr. President I ask unanimous consent to be excused until Wednesday morning, January 30, (Signed) Senator Waldron.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections? Senator Waldron's absence. Hearing none. So ordered. Senator Lewis for what purpose do you rise? O.K. We have a recess motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move we recess until 1:30. (Signed) Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to recess until 1:30. All those in favor of recessing until 1:30 say aye, those opposed say no. Ayes have it. We will recess until 1:30.
