PRESIDENT: Will the Legislature please come to order, we will have prayer by the Chaplain.

CHAPLAIN: (Prayer given.)

PRESIDENT: Roll Call. Once again, the Chair would inquire if you have all indicated your presence? Have you all indicated your presence? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Are there corrections for the journal?

CLERK: None Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Excellent. Do we have petitions or memorials?

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a communication from the Governor.

PRESIDENT: Read the communication.

CLERK: (Read communications, correspondence, referred bills.)

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session, and capable of transacting business, I am signing LB66.

CLERK: (Read Committee hearings.) Mr. President, we have a unanimous consent request to have printed amendments to LB811, signed Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: Are there any objections to printing the amendments? Any objections to printing the amendments to LB811, was it?

CLERK: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Hearing none, so ordered. The amendments will be printed.

CLERK: O.K., Mr. President, I move to suspend the rules and consider bills on Final Reading for today, signed Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter for his suspension of the rules motion. Senator Carpenter?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, you will recall, this is a motion on the reference of A-bills?

CLERK: No, this is the motion to suspend the rules on Final Reading for today.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have two up there. I move that we suspend the rules and pass the bills that are set for tomorrow. I do that in part because, at least I have a hard time getting oriented to what has happened or what is going on that gives me, and I presume everybody else, a few minutes to get adjusted. I move the rules be suspended and we pass the bills tomorrow, today.

PRESIDENT: Is there any other further discussion of the motion? The question is, shall the rules then be suspended and the Final Reading scheduled for tomorrow be taken today? All those in favor of that motion will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, Mr. President to suspend the rules.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, the motion carries, the rules are suspended. We will take up then tomorrow's Final Reading today. Today's Final Reading begins with LB104, the constitutional amendment. Alright, we
