PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: We just had a short discussion with Mr. Kalb, and what it boils down to is that if we pass this bill in this form, we are building in some conflicts of definition into the statute. Now, we have got two alternatives, we can either pass this bill and then adopt some amendments to some other bill and correct those conflicts or we can hold this bill and adopt the amendment to eliminate the conflict and have this bill right, and we won't be creating a problem. Now if we for example adopt or pass this bill this way we are building in a conflict and then if the next bill that we tie them to doesn't pass, we are in trouble. I would suggest that we still hold the bill for a week, lets get together first with this man and we will work out the amendments so that we are now not building in a conflict and be done with it.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Again, I'm glad that I went out and listened to the conversation. The gentleman said that there was no conflict in this bill he said that it was a good bill, but I would agree that we will hold it a week and for goodness sakes, anybody, and there is a minor amendment and it has nothing to do with the Revenue and has nothing to do with the clarification of the title or anything else, we have held this book or a...a...bill for two weeks before practically, so I say lets hold it because I listened to this gentleman and he said that it is a good bill and that it is good the way it is written. Lets hold a it and if there is any conflicts....I think that we needed to have this bill passed a year ago, but I would agree to hold it now and there is certainly no conflict with the revenue.

PRESIDENT: Senator SLahmer your light is on did you wish to be recognized? Alright, the question is, I suppose at this point that the Chair is asking, Senator Goodrich is asking unanimous consent to hold LB513, bracket 513 on Final reading for a week. Are there objections to bracketing the bill for a week? Any objections to bracketing 513? Hearing none, so ordered. The bill is then bracketed on Final Reading. That will bring up then the Final reading of LB595. Attention please, and I would like to have the Senators in their seats. Under the rules of the legislature we are on Final Reading, you are supposed to be in your seats.

CLERK: Read LB595.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with the question is shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 45 ayes, 0 nays and 4 not voting (Vote appears on pages 414-415 of Legislative Journal).

PRESIDENT: The bill is passed. That concludes Final Reading. Are there resdutions on the desk?
