PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Kennedy. Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Yes. Mr. President and fellow members. This is the bill that was offered to us by particularly Dr. Sparks in working with the physicians act and he has worked with our committee on it and the committee would like to have this bill introduced. If you have any questions I would be happy to answer them. It does give us an opportunity for education over the state in rural, state and urban with the Physicians Act. Education Act.

PRESIDENT: Senator Skarda did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR SKARDA: Mr. President I move that we suspend the rules and take up the bills on Final Reading tomorrow today.

PRESIDENT: Stand by just a minute.

CLERK: We need to vote on that Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We will take care of Senator Kennedy's motion first. Is there any further discussion of Senator Kennedy's motion? Which is of course to introduce the bill.

SENATOR KENNEDY: It's by Public Health and Welfare Committee.

PRESIDENT: Once again the question is, Shall the bill be introduced. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The motion is to introduce the bill. Senator Kennedy's committee. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, Mr. President, on the motion to introduce.

PRESIDENT: Very good. The bill is introduced. Clerk want to read the title.

CLERK: LB 1005 (read)

PRESIDENT: Senator Skarda has made the motion that we suspend the rules and take up the Final Reading scheduled for tomorrow today. Is there further discussion or debate of that particular motion. If not, then the question is; Shall the rules be suspended and tomorrow's Final Reading be taken up today. All those in favor of suspending the rules to do that will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, no nays, 17 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails, we will take up Final Reading just as soon as we can clear the floor and get the Senators in their seats, please. We are preparing for Final Reading. First bill on Final Reading will be LB 92. Just as soon as we get all of the Senators in their seats we will be able to start Final Reading. Senator Nore for what purpose did you want to be recognized?

SENATOR NORE: Personal privilege. I'd like to ask Senator DeCamp a question if he would answer it.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp do you want to answer a question from Senator Nore while we are waiting here? Senator DeCamp.
