PRESIDENT: Senator Savage is asking unanimous consent to withdraw his name from LB 902. Are there objections to the withdrawal of his name from that bill? Any objections? Hearing none. So ordered. The name is withdrawn. Any other motions on the desk? Senator Kennedy what is your pleasure regarding LB 874?

SENATOR KENNEDY: Mr. President, fellow members. I find that in our complicated system that we wind up with 2 bills that are identical and we have already passed the other bill and worked on it in Committee. And this is a similar bill introduced by Health and Welfare Committee the same as the other bill. So I would ask that this would be withdrawn.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the bill be withdrawn. That does take a machine vote. All those in favor of allowing Senator Kennedy to withdraw LB 874 vote aye, all those opposed vote no. This is just to give Senator Kennedy authority to withdraw a duplicate bill. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes and no nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is withdrawn. Before we begin the next piece of business the Chair would like to acknowledge the presence this morning of 30 students from Cathedral School here in Lincoln, Nebraska, from Senator Luedtke's district. The instructor is Mrs. Lee Cording, and Mrs. Morris is one of the mothers along to help sponsor the group.
