CLERK: No, I said most of my stack of amendments were withdrawn.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Oh, I thought we were going to take up my amendments first.

CLERK: I'm sorry. Then..Goodrich amendments.

SPEAKER: Yes, we are taking up the Goodrich amendments now.

CLERK: And I have several of those.'

SENATOR GOODRICH: Can I just go ahead and start explaining them. Mr. President, can I go ahead and start explaining them.

SPEAKER: Yes, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: O.K. Now the first..there are 6 amendments attached to this group.

SPEAKER: Senator Goodrich, do you want to take these one at a time?

SENATOR GOODRICH: We can adopt them all as a set of amendments Well...

SPEAKER: I believe we should take them one at a time. It's too confusing to take all 7 of them. Unless the body decides different.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Now the first amendment is a two page amendment, about a page and a half actually, which actually does nothing but straighten up some problems we found in the committee amendments. If you read them you would have a hard time understanding the amendment itself unless you applied them to the committee amendments, but I move the adoption of these amendments, which are literally amendments to the committee amendments. They are just detail.

SPEAKER: Well, you're then moving of the adoption of all the amendments?

SENATOR GOODRICH: No, the first amendment on the desk. I was going to take them one at a time.

SPEAKER: You are going to take them one at a time. You are moving for the adoption of your first amendment.

CLERK: This is the one that has paragraphs 1 through 10.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

SPEAKER: Have you finished explaining that? Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Unless there is some question.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. Chairman, I'm only trying to be helpful. First let me say I'm a landlord. So I'm not without interest in this bill. And I would like to have them adopt all of Senator Goodrich's amendments, which I presume are from the Homebuilders Association. And when we get all through the amendments, then to instruct the Clerk to re-write the old bill with the amendments imposed so at least we can understand what is before us. Is that in order?
