SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. Speaker, members of the body. Senator Murphy would you yield to a question?

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy yield?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Would it be all right with you if we Bracket this for one week. There is 38 other states that has the same days and there is imput coming to see how they are handling the situation.

SENATOR MURPHY: It is my understanding that there is further consideration. In fact, I think our President, yours and mine, has even brought up the possibility that it could be restored Federally which I would heartily endorse. I have certainly no objection to laying over, Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: A week from today, O.K.

SENATOR MURPHY: A week from today would be just fine.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to laying over 729 for a week? Any..Senator Syas..Do you object.

SENATOR SYAS: Senator Rasmussen I think next week we discuss state aid, so that's the date he really wants.

PRESIDENT: Choose your date, men. Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Senator Syas you did bring up a good point. It might take most of that day. We had better set another date for that. How about Wednesday would be alright. Day before..

PRESIDENT: Wednesday of next week.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: O.K.

SENATOR MURPHY: I might reply just briefly to Senator Syas. The banks of course as a matter of course normally give notice what their closing date will be regardless even though it is one that is known or unknown, but I do concur there will be confusion. Your Government is at work.

PRESIDENT: Oh, let's leave that one alone. All right there is a unanimous consent motion then to Bracket the bill until next Wednesday of next week, are there objections. Senator Stull do you want to be heard, do you object to Bracketing it.

SENATOR STULL: No I'm not objecting, but I would ask unanimous consent to have my name added to the bill, I don't think that would actually been accomplished.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull is asking..O.K. the bill..if there are no objections the bill will be Bracketed until Wednesday of next week fine. Then Senator Stull, now listen carefully, we had some problems regarding this last week. Senator Stull is asking unanimous consent to have his name added to the bill. Are there objections to adding Senator Stull's name to the bill? Hearing none. So ordered. And his name will be added to the bill. Thank you. Wait a minute, that brings up for General File discussion then of LB 730. Senator Carstens bill. Senator Carstens bill, yes.
