SENATOR CARPENTER: I have no desire to eliminate debate. And I have no desire to put it off until tomorrow. I didn't think it would create a lot of discussion because I understood this is what the body wanted me to do.

PRESIDENT: Well, all right then. Next to speak really was Senator Whitney. Senator Whitney did you want to be heard on this issue and then Senator Simpson.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I would be willing to house in the back two pillars back there. But housing everything up here in front I'm against. And let's try a portion of it first. So therefore, I'm going to have to vote against the motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, I think that my vote would be affected by which side of the chamber they are going to put these on. So I would like to know if it's over there I'm for it, if it's over here, I'm against it.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Make a motion where you want it.

SENATOR SIMPSON: I want it on the south side if you are going to do it because if it's over there I'm for it, if it's over here I'm against it.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, make a motion where you want it.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Well, I want it on the south side. If you are going to do it because wed like to leave our side open.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I accept the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Now we have an amendment to the Carpenter motion. Senator Carpenter's accepted it. So actually we're debating now only the issue whether you want the south glassed in. All those in favor of the Simpson amendment to glass in the south side then.
