Alright then, the question is, do you want to adopt the motion made by Senator Proud as amended by Senator Carpenter and you know the subject matter and the contents thereof, all those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. The Chair would rule that this would take 25 votes in order to bind the body to this particular action. This is the vote to support Senator Proud's motion as amended by Senator Carpenter to have a delegation call on the President of the United States to inform him regarding the conditions in Nebraska, regarding the truck situation. Once again the Chair would ask have you all voted? Senator Chambers thank you. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, no nays Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you the motion is adopted and the Executive Board is then ordered to take care of the matter. Senator Carpenter?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I would like to say to the body that the Executive Board and unless there is some complications should meet, I would think, at 1:00 tomorrow at the usual place in order to discuss this and any other thing that any member of this Legislature might want to present to the Board. This is your Board and we attempt, in every case, to do what the majority of the body wants to do. So we will have a meeting tomorrow at 1:00.
